About this News 1999

Dear speedskating friends,

the 4th issue of the International Seniors' Speed Skating News (ISSSC-News) is ready now and you will find a lot of informations about the events and results of the last winter 1998/1999, informations about the International Seniors' Speed Skating Committee (ISSSC), the ISSSC Records' List 1999 (inofficial world record list of the seniors from 30 years), the new ISSSC Records' Specifications, adapted to the world record rules of the ISU, and above all the List of Seniors' Speedskating Events 1999/2000 and the announcements of these Competitions.

Before dicussing some highlights of this News I have to give you an important information:
Please note that from 2000 the International Seniors' Speed Skating News (ISSS-News) will be sent only to subscribers and to participants of International Competitions with a fee for the costs of the ISSSC (apart from the ISU and the ISSSC).

International Competitions with a fee for the costs of the ISSSC are at present:
Seniors' International Games, Seniors International German Sprint, Seniors' International Master Cup, Seniors' International Davos Meeting.

I'm delighted that we have for the first time a report from Seniors' US-Speedskating in this issue of the ISSS-News and also an announcement of an international competition in the USA. The specialty of the Seniors' US-Speedskating is the mass-start, also at short distances. The reported records are also records of such mass-started competitions.

For the first time we have a new allround competition at Davos/Switzerland, the Seniors' DAVOS MEETING. This competition may be a good opportunity to visit the famous Davos with its well-known fast natural 400 m track and further fantastic winter sports opportunities.

The Seniors' MASTER CUP has changed from Berlin-Wilmersdorf/Germany to Baselga di Piné/Italy, because in 2000 the Seniors' Games take place in Berlin. We are delighted about this nice place in the alpes, where the Games 1998 took place.

In 2000 the Coupe Internationale des Maitres du Québec again takes place in Ste-Foy (Québec)/Canada in combination with a natural ice marathon. This interesting competition did not take place last year.

And the greatest seniors' allround competition, the 9th Seniors' International GAMES 2000 with 150 participants, will take place for the first time in an ice-hall, in Berlin-Hohenschönhausen, a well-known place with very fast ice. I think that many ISSSC Records will be broken. We are looking forward to this great event!

I believe that we have a phantastic International Program 1999/2000 in Seniors' Speedskating! I hope to see you at one ore more of the announced events.

The „8th Seniors' International Speed Skating Games 1999“ in Seinäjoki / Finland

It started very harmless on Monday evening: The travel agency told us, that the direct-flight from Berlin to Helsinki with continuation of the journey to Seinäjoki would be canceled and we would have to fly from Berlin to Düsseldorf and than to Helsinki. We, that have been the speedskaters from Berlin and Sachsen.

At 6 a.m. on Tuesday morning we were at the gate of our airline and we got the tickets to Düsseldorf and Helsinki. But because of the bad weather, the plane could not start in time and we arrived Düsseldorf too late – the plane to Helsinki startet just as we landet. What was now to do? – The answer was just as easy as surprising. We were set into an aeroplane to London and from London we had to fly to Helsinki. But on those days like this day, everything is going wrong – our flight to London startet also too late and we arrived London just a few minutes after the plane to Helsinki was gone.

We decided to stay in London for the rest of the day and the next night. On Wednesday morning we wanted to try the continuation of our journey. Our time in the british capital was used für sightseeing and relaxing. And really – we could not belive it – we arrived in Helsinki on Wednesday midday – after about 30 hours. The 4 hours train connection from Helsinki to Seinäjoki have been a ridiculous short time in comparision to the rest of our journey.

Arrived in Seinäjoki we were not able to breathe – this we had not expected: lcy temperatures from -20°C and below have made the breathing difficult. The speedskaters considered, if in this weather conditions the competitions could be startet.

The competitions were started. After the first trainings had taken place in difficult weather conditions, at the weekend the temperatures got higher and higher. The speed skating track had been prepared perfectly – everything was very well. And this you can see in the results of the competitions: 121 speedskaters from 9 nations did start on this

weekend in Seinäjoki. We have had 2 Canadians, 32 from Finland, 16 Germans, 3 Italians, 31 from the Netherlands, 28 Norwegians, 2 from Russia, 4 from Switzerland and 3 from Sweden. All of them have given their best and they have shown excellent sports. 29 ISSSC Records from 1998 have been lowered – many personal bests rounded off the sporting results.

Of course – there has not taken place only sport, also the sociability has had enough place in the schedule: On Thursday the organisation committee invited us to the official opening reception of the games – the bars and restaurants in the hotels have been also used, to meet old and new friends. In the leisure time we have had the possibility and enough time to have sightseeing in Seinäjoki. The highlight of the festivities was the victory-ceremony with banquet on Sunday evening.

I think, I can speak for all competitors of the 8th Games in Seinäjoki: It has been very nice days in Finland and perfectly organised Speed Skating Games in Seinäjoki! We have to say „Thank you“ to the organisation-committee for the very good work in these days.

In the year 2000 we will meet all eachother again in Berlin – than for the first time of the Seniors' International Speed Skating Games in a Speed Skating Hall. I wish all speedskaters a good start into the next saison and a relaxed and stressless journey to Berlin.

Lots of Snow and Fast Times

5th Seniors' International German Sprint in Inzell/Germany, 7.-8. February 1999

At the arrival in Inzell Thursday afternoon no problems could be seen from the winter. Snow was only to find high in the mountains but not in Inzell at a sea-level of 700 m. It was a little cloudy but not so bad for speed skating. The same weather was on Friday morning, but in the afternoon it started snowing and there were already some problems on the ice in the late afternoon during the training because of intensive snowing. The snowing went on during the drawing and the opening buffet in the restaurant in the ice stadium. At the opening buffet the participants heard some about the new ISSSC Record List, the unofficial World Record List of the Seniors' from 30 years. About 2/3 of the competitors and some guests took part in the bavarian rustic buffet of fine savouriness, became acquainted and discussed the competitions of the next days and especially the the snowy winter weather.

After the opening buffet I had a small walk from the ice stadium into the center of the small nice bavarian town of Inzell. I wanted only to have a little movement but it was hard work because of the deep fresh snow of about half a meter. And it went on snowing very strong. I went to the bed in the Sport Hotel in the ice stadium. Early in Saturday morning I was awakened from machines and the team of the ice stadium which started to clean the ice stadium and the ice from about one meter of snow. The snowing had stopped now, there were only some snow showers from time to time. I had a good breakfast buffet and some talks with competitors. And then I repeated my walk to the center of Inzell for shopping, it was much easier than in the last evening because the snow ploughs had worked well early in the morning. And I enjoyed the phantastic winter landscape of the bavarian alpes with the fresh deep white snow. It looked phantastic!

The competition started in time at 1 p. m., the team of the ice stadium had done an admirable work in cleaning the stadium from 1 m snow! During the competition of the first day the ice only could be treated with the very special planing machine of Inzell because of snow showers from time to time. But nevertheless the ice was astonishing fast as had been shown by fast times and by 8 lowered ISSSC Records. At the second competition day the weather was still better, the sun was to be seen and the ice stadium and the mountains around looked phantastic with so much snow! The ice had very high quality because now it could be treated with water. 10 ISSSC Records 1998 on single distances could be lowered at this day and 7 ISSSC Records 1998 at the 4 distance classification.

The jury and the competition bureau worked very well and very fast. The victory ceremony took place only half an hour after the end of the competition! So the competitors could start their journey home early in the afternoon.

The days in Inzell again were wonderful! Many thanks to the leader of the competition, Mr. Hubert Graf and his team for their perfect work. We look forward to the next winter and the 6th International German Sprint 2000 in Inzell! v.s.

4th Seniors Speed Skating Master Cup Berlin 1999**16th -17th January 1999, Berlin-Wilmersdorf**

The 4th Seniors Speed Skating Master Cup in Berlin-Wilmersdorf in Germany was a small but efficient event. The weather was kind. On Saturday there was a light drizzle of rain but on Sunday the sun shone. The competition was organized perfectly by Dominik Wehling and his crew from the Berliner Schlittschuh-Club e.V. The activities of all the reliable people, who helped in so many ways including the starts, time taking, indication of rounds, referee tasks and PC-evaluation of the results were highly appreciated. The speaker, Mrs. Ney, in particular, is to be thanked for not only getting the competitors to the starts in a relaxed and easy manner but also for catching the attention of the ordinary spectators, the Berliners, who were using the hockey field inside the speed skating rink for their leisure time skating.

There was some criticism from the competitors about the cost of the entrance fee. It has to be remembered though that the entrance fee also included the delicious buffet in the nearby located new Hotel Albatros. Additionally, it must be mentioned that the costs of running competitions have increased in recent years.

As to the competition itself, the number of competitors was relatively small. Only 27 men and 9 women participants took part. The reason for this low turnout was probably that there were too many other events taking place at the same time. Many regulars of the international competitions did not show up. In spite of this though the Master Cup in Berlin was a highly successful occasion. Dominik Wehling appreciated that 15 ISSSC Records (Seniors' Unofficial World Records) were lowered. The first place in AK 35 was achieved by Rene Schöfisch (GER). The fastest skaters in the different age groups were especially among the Dutchmen: Victor Van den Hoff (AK 40), Sallo Spelter (AK 45), Peter Slikker and Piet van der Meulen (AK 50) and Willem Wisser (AK 65). In AK 55 and AK 75(!) the Finns were the fastest. These, especially noteworthy, were Malti Kilpeläinen (AK 55) and Tauno Nurmi (AK 75). James Whiddon (AK 50) and Eugene Kurmey (AK 65) from Canada also achieved good results. Concerning the 9 ladies, only one or two competitors took part in each of the respective age groups. If one woman were to be singled out to be in first place, this would have to be Ria Slikker (NED, AK 50). Her achievement was outstanding. Congratulations! Commendable results were also achieved by Birgit Schöfisch (GER, AK 35) and Liane Paeschke (GER, AK 25).

Mentioning only the commendable results of particular participants does not mean that the achievements of the other participants have not been taken in account. All participants were highly motivated and good results were achieved. The skills of those who took part were admired by the spectators. The event was a pleasurable occasion giving credence to our belief that senior speed skating provides a joy of living.

Lets compete again!

If the organizer or the referee of the competition does not send the above-mentioned papers to the Correspondance Address of the ISSSC, the competitor in question must send in minimum one Announcement of the Competition (if not issued in the ISSS-News), one Official Program of the competition and one Official Protocol together with the completely filled in ISSSC Record Application Form to the Correspondance Address of the ISSSC.

The Official Protocol of the Competition must be printed and must contain

- a) every draw by lot and arrangement of pairs which has taken place (ISU Rule 268 § 1 a);
- b) the times of automatic timekeeping, recorded in hundredth of a second (ISU Rule 268 § 1 b), including starting times, lap times, accumulated lap times, finish times;
- c) the times of manual timekeeping – accumulated lap times in tenth of a second (see ISU Rule 274) – final times in hundredth of a second (see ISU Rule 246, § 6), (ISU Rule 268 § 1 c).
- d) Name of the organizer and names and functions of the jury members, weather conditions.

4 Provisions

- 4.1 Result reached at a national or international announced competition with 5 year age groups from 30 years (see above § 1) by a speed skater with a competition license of his national speed skating association, being member of the International Skating Union (I.S.U.).
- 4.2 Result better than at the ISSSC Records' List of the last year of competition, published by the ISSSC in the last issue of the International Seniors' Speed Skating News (ISSS-News) or in another manner.

If there is not mentioned a record for a 5 year age group in the ISSSC Records' List, the first of a race in this 5 year age group may make a record application.
- 4.3 ISSSC Records over all distances may be recognized also for times achieved in quartet starts (see ISU Rule 273 § 1 f).
- 4.4 Distances to be skated must be in accordance with the announcement (see ISU Rule 273 § 3 b).
- 4.5 The track must be a Standard Speed Skating Track of 400 meters (ISU Rule 273 § 4 a).
- 4.6 The conditions of ISU Rules 207 (track), 244 (watches), 245 (manual time keeping) and 246 (automatic time keeping) must be observed. Automatic timekeeping must have been used (ISU Rule 273 § 1 b).

- 4.7 In races over several laps, the time must be taken and noted for each lap. Also the accumulated lap times shall be recorded in units of a hundredth of a second when automatic timekeeping is used and in units of a hundredth of a second when automatic timekeeping is used and in units of a tenth of a second for the manual timekeeping (ISU Rule 247).
 - 4.8 ISSSC Records for Allround combinations over four distances can only be recognized if the competition is held over a maximum of three days, and the distances are skated in the order indicated in the announcement (ISU Rule 273 § 1 c).
 - 4.9 ISSSC Records for the Sprint combination over four distances can only be recognized if the competition is over two days, with each individual distance skated only once each day and changed starting lanes (see ISU Rule 226) on the second day (ISU Rule 273 § 1 d).
 - 4.10 If the existing ISSSC Record is broken more than once on the same day in competitions at the same venue, only the best time obtained shall be recognized as a new ISSSC Record. However, when the final classification for the 500 meters is decided based on the total time in two races, each 500 meters race is to be considered as a separate competition (see ISU Rule 273 § 5).
 - 4.11 Any competitor who equals an existing ISSSC Record shall have his name entered in the ISSSC Records' List (see ISU Rule 273 § 6).
 - 4.12 For each Record obtained, or the equalling of any record, the ISSSC shall issue a diploma to the skater (see ISU Rule 273 § 7).
- 5 Decision about ISSSC Records, Issue of the ISSSC Records' List**
- 5.1 The ISSSC decides on the recognition of new ISSSC Records.
 - 5.2 The ISSSC Records' List of the last winter season will be published by the ISSSC in the International Seniors' Speed Skating News (ISSS-News) or in another manner every year.

2005 – 2006 Nominated candidates: Baselga di Piné/ITALY, Inzell/GERMANY, Zakopane/Poland (but only if artificial ice is installed)

Master Cup 2000 in Baselga di Piné/ITALY

The Seniors' International Speed Skating Master Cup, organized by Dominik Wehling in the last years in Berlin-Wilmersdorf, changes the place in 2000. It will be organized by Sergio Anesi in Baselga di Piné/ITALY because of the Games in Berlin.

New International Allround Competition in Davos/SWITZERLAND

The 1st Seniors' International Speed Skating DAVOS MEETING 2000 is a new allround competition for Seniors in 5 year age groups. It takes place at the 14. – 15. January 2000 on the famous and fast standard 400 m natural ice rink of Davos-Platz and will be organized by Sigi Ritter, ISCD Davos.

9th Seniors' International Games 2000, the first Games in an Ice-Hall

The 9th Seniors' International Speed Skating Games 2000 in Berlin-Hohenschönhausen are the first Games in an ice-hall. These Games, at first planned for the open air track at Berlin-Wilmersdorf, now changed to the second track in Berlin, the covered track in Berlin-Hohenschönhausen. The track of Berlin-Hohenschönhausen is well known for its fast ice, especially since this hall got a new heating system in 1998. The participants of the last German Seniors' Championships in March 1999 already enjoyed this fine ice. The Games 2000 will be organized by the Turn- und Sport-Club Berlin, TSC Berlin. Department leader speedskating of this club is Jacqueline Börner, winner of the gold medal over 1500 m at the Olympic Games 1992 in Albertville/FRA. In the Organization Committee: Dr. Claudia Kijora and Dominik Wehling, both of them experienced in organizing Seniors' Competitions.

Natural Ice Marathon before the 10th Games 2001 in Québec/CANADA

The club Les Maîtres Du Québec, which will organize the 10th Seniors' Speed Skating Games in Ste-Foy (Québec)/CANADA in 2001, plans a Natural Ice Marathon 100 km at a lake near Québec one week before these Games. For getting experience a Natural Ice Marathon 50 km will be organized one week after the Allround Competition „Coupe Internationale des Maîtres du Québec 1999“, see „Seniors' International Speed Skating Events“ and „Announcements“ in this issue of the ISSS-News.

First Seniors' Championships of the Netherlands with 5 year age groups

At the 19./21. January 1999 the first Seniors' Allround Championships of The Netherlands took place in 5 year age groups in the new ice-hall of Dronten. The time limits for these Championships were very low. 66 Competitors, 21 Ladies and 45 Men took part in these Championships. 23 ISSSC Records 1998 were lowered.

Sessions of the ISSSC

The 10th Session of the International Seniors' Speed Skating Committee (ISSSC) took place at the 10th and 14th February, 1999, in Seinäjoki/FIN during the week of the 9th Games. The 11th Session took place at the 14th August, 1999, in Krefeld/GER. Decisions were taken in the following fields: Places for the next Games (see above), new competition Davos (see above), restrictions of the participants of the Games 2000 (see announcement of the Games 2000), alterations in the Specifications of the ISSSC Records (see this issue of the ISSS-News), fee for the costs of the ISSSC rised to 15 DM (from 10 DM, see announcements of the international competitions).

Masters instead of Seniors

The use of "Masters" instead of "Seniors" for the Seniors from 30 years in competitions with 5 year age groups shall be discussed with the ISU, as decided by the ISSSC at ist 11th Session. The use of "Masters" for Seniors from 30 years in competitions with 5 year age groups would help to recognize Competitions for Seniors from 30 years with 5 year age groups in the competition calendars, e.g. the ISU Calendar. At present this is not possible in some competition calendars as can be seen from the ISU Calendar 1999/2000.

ISSS-News 1999, ISSS-News 2000

The ISSSC decided, that in 1999 all senior skaters from 30 years known to the ISSSC shall get the ISSS-News 1999. But from 2000 only the skaters who pay a fee for the ISSSC in one of the great international competitions or who subscribed the ISSS-News, will get the issue ISSS-News 2000. The great international competitions with fee for the ISSSC are: Seniors' International Games, Seniors International Master Cup, Seniors International German Sprint, Seniors' International Davos Meeting.

Specifications of ISSSC Records

As decided by the ISSSC on the 10th and 11th Session, the Specifications of ISSSC Records were altered and completed. Only automatically timekeeping will be accepted (no manual timekeeping). Men Allround Small (500 m, 1500 m, 1000 m, 3000 m) will be taken up into the List of ISSSC Records. The Specifications are adapted to the ISU Rules for World Records as far as possible (see Specifications of ISSSC Records in this issue of the ISSS-News).

ISU Contacts

The discussion of Dr. Volker Serini about Seniors' Speed Skating (Seniors from 30 years in 5 year age groups) with Mr. Ottavio Cinquanta (ISU President) and Mr. Gerd Zimmermann (ISU Vice-President) at the last World Championships in Heerenveen in March 1999 yielded the following results: The ISU accepts the competition activities of the Seniors. The ISU thinks that it is to early for a Seniors' Commission in the ISU. Further discussions shall take place in the future

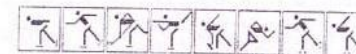

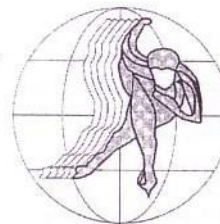
